- When will I receive my Catastrophic Event Tax Abatement refund?
- Will there be an extension to pay my property taxes?
- What if my title, license plate, registration, parking permit or ID were lost or destroyed due to a hurricane?
- I was unable to renew my driver license or registration on time due to a hurricane.

Greetings, I certainly hope most of our residents have recovered from the storms as much as conceivably possible, let's pray that our 100 year occurrence holds true and will not rear its ugly head again. Onward to better things heading our way!

SAVE THE DATE: Saturday, March 8th, will be our annual neighborhood yard sale for all to partake in from 8am to 1pm. We do this to alleviate the need for random, individual sales that tend to add unnecessary traffic, especially now that we are heading into the



"in season", busy time on the island. The past years have been very good for all and we generate a lot of traffic flow throughout the neighborhood. The Association will be placing "No Parking" signs on the West sides of all streets and ask that all help enforce this in order to ensure smooth traffic flow. Upon conclusion, or the next day, the signs will be removed. In closing, please be safe and remain vigilant in ensuring our community remains safe and relevant for all.

In the news locally ...

- ENTRANCE TRAFFIC LIGHT Positive progress continues towards effort to install light at our entrance. Bids due in March, and construction as early as late Summer. Exact completion timeframe not yet known, but should be before the end of 2026 per FDOT.
- CORTEZ RISES ABOVE POST HURRICANES Cortez Village was severely damaged during
 the 2024 hurricane season, however the
 community stands together and is rebuilding.
- RED TIDE PLAGUES GULF WATERS In mid-February 2025 early signs of red tide began to surface in the waters in, and around, Anna Maria Island south and Longboat Key.
 Residents with respiratory problems are advised to be cautious.
- CORTEZ BRIDGE PRE-CONSTRUCTION
 BEGINS The Cortez Bridge replacement
 project, estimated to cost \$77 million, has
 begun with impacts of the first phase
 requiring road closures. Full construction of
 the bridge will begin mid-2026. Great

Landscaping Committee

The entrance landscaping project is currently paused while we address several key issues:

Irrigation System

- Islands 3 and 4 are experiencing water pressure problems
- An irrigation specialist will conduct system testing before the project progresses

Planting Plans

- Currently coordinating schedules with Trent Moore to discuss:
 - Plant replacement options
 - Cost estimates for new plantings
 - Professional installation services

Community-Building Hands-on Project

One idea has been proposed to get the community involved in the entrance work. If you're interested in joining the volunteer team, please contact me at hoalandscaping@sanremoshores.org.

Next Steps

- Complete irrigation system assessment
- Meet with landscape designer to finalize plant selections and costs
- Determine whether to proceed with professional or volunteer planting, or combo
- Schedule and coordinate replanting work


A New Face to Membership

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FMCCA Update

Regarding an update of the amendment needed to our Manatee County Suburban Plan, to correct an error presently in the definition of "incompatibility", for the high-rise development, along county suburban roads in the county comprehensive plan; I received a call from the county planning department. Again, I was informed that they could not find certain enclosures I have previously sent to them and the County Commission.

Accordingly, on behalf of FMCCA I resent the information requested in a letter from me dated 12/11/24 with copies to the county planning division manager, Sarah Schenk assistant, county attorney, and our HOA president Jeremy Williams without enclosures. Also, copy with enclosures to our newly elected County Commissioner for our district Tal Saddique. I was also informed that the proposed amendment by the Federation will be reviewed by the county's consultant and the county attorney before it is considered by the planning commission and county commission, at a scheduled public hearing. Sometime in February and March of this year at that time the Federation will request the above error to be corrected.
